
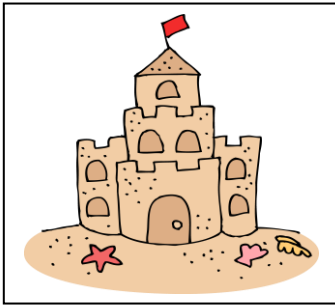

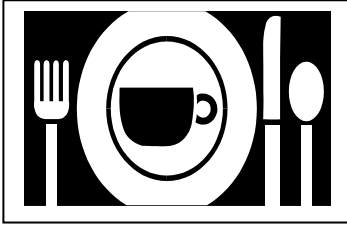

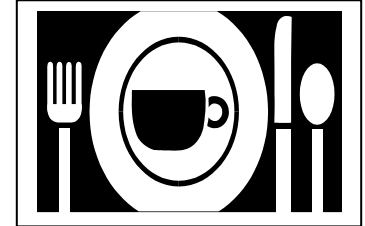

TRIKE-A-THON UPDATE

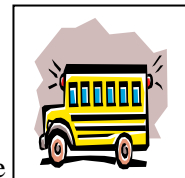

SWIM LESSONS

Wow! This has been a super fast school year! As we leave the school year behind and enter the summer, we have a lot of changes ahead of us. We will begin the month of June with the Medarva Screening on the 3rd. Children should already be registered for this. Screening will take place starting at 9:30 so please arrive by then if your child is participating. The Tabby Cats will have Graduate pictures taken on June 4th. We will also have class pictures taken on this day. The Tabby Cats will have the last Graduation practice on the 4th also. Graduation is June 7th at 7:00pm. Please have your Graduate here by 6:50. They are ready! We have several changes in our extra-curricular activity schedule this month. Computer will continue on Fridays. 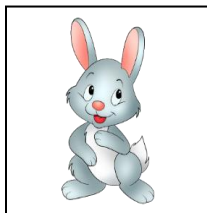
LETTERS FROM THE TEACHERS

Dear Parents,

I can't believe we're at the end of another month already! Our letters of the month were X, Y, and Z. We listed words that begin with each letter, practiced tracing them, and made a book for each. Throughout the summer, we will continue to work on our tracing skills. We have been learning our addresses and phone numbers as well. Ask your child - you may be surprised by how much of them they know! Our featured author of the month was Jonathan London, who writes the “Froggy” series of books. Our favorite of these was Froggy Learns to Swim. We began May by talking about gardening. We also talked about Cinco de Mayo, with a worksheet packet that included tracing, matching, patterns, and size order. Week 2 started by talking about flowers. We talked about the process of a seed growing into a flower, then colored pictures of it. We also used flowers and dice to practice counting and tracing our numbers. The rest of the week was about celebrating one of our favorite people - Mom! We used our thumb prints to make a special gift that reminds Mom we love her a whole bunch. We also made a book about Mother's Day. The next week was about babies, both people and animals. We talked about animal babies with special names, like a kitten, a piglet, and a calf. We then colored a book of animals and their babies. We also talked about how baby birds hatch from eggs and live in nests, then made baby birds in a nest. Moving on to human babies, we discussed some of the special things that babies need, like diapers, bottles, and pacifiers. We made miniature “baby” paintings with small pieces of paper and q-tips. Check out our gallery on the wall of our classroom! We ended the week by talking about how different we are now from when we were babies, then drawing “selfies.” The following week was all



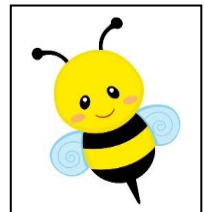

Our range of activities were as follows: Parts of a Strawberry Plant, Tracing Z, The Mouse and the Big, Red, Ripe Strawberry book and color sheet, Printing Z, and our delicious food activity was our Strawberry Treat. Finally, we all participated in the St. Jude Trike A Thon and Animal Babies week. 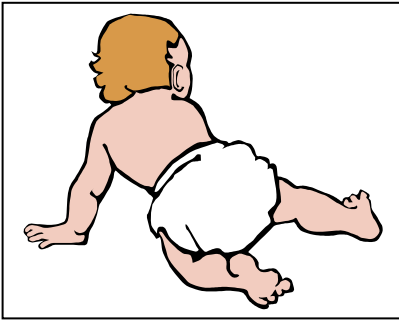
◆ Tabby Cat Class

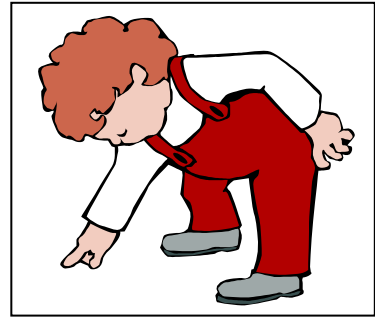

We celebrated Cinco De Mayo by counting in Spanish and practicing graphing and reading number words. We made your beautiful cards for Mother's Day and planted your spider plants. Hopefully, they are growing! The children really enjoyed planting them. The next week we moved on to gardening. We learned who can be a gardener and what he/she needs to work in a garden. We learned the names of gardening tools and some gardening terms. We then read the book Tops and Bottoms and practiced story recall and thinking skills. We read words to label pictures and practiced fact vs. fiction. We brought the whole plants, gardening, vegetables theme to a close by making our class garden. They should have learned the names of some vegetables and know what part of the plant we eat. We only had time to spend one day on baby animals. We brainstormed the baby names of animals and were able to fill the whole white board with what we know. They were stumped on some I named so they should have earned something new. We then made a book reviewing some of these names. We then moved on to measurements. We named different ways to measure things and named the tool used to measure it. We practiced measuring with different items and compared measurements, like short vs. long and heavy vs. light. We then celebrated Memorial Day by practicing ordinal numbers and positions, and matching sentences to pictures. The last week of the month was the Trike-a-thon week. We spent time learning about why we were having it, who we were helping and why it is so important. We learned safety rules for riding bikes, trikes, scooters, etc. They loved riding on the final day! Thanks to all who donated to this great cause. June will be very eventful for the Tabby Cats. I look forward to continuing our time together! Happy Father's Day!
